EV EXPERIENCE

Over the past couple years, GCEA has allowed its members the opportunity to take one of the co-op's electric vehicles on loan for a week to check the features and benefits of EV ownership. The loaner program has been a huge hit with members. We offer daily test drives in our Tesla Model 3 and Chevy Bolt.

PATRONAGE CAPITAL

In 2017, GCEA rolled out a new option for your annual patronage capital allocation. You can either receive the current value of your allocation or leave it invested in your cooperative.

RENEWABLE ENERGY PROGRAMS

If you want more green power, GCEA offers our members several different ways to voluntarily support clean energy through our Green the Grid programs. You can easily reduce your carbon footprint by simply signing up for one or all of the options.



Green Power program

The Green Power program provides a way for members to support renewable energy. You can offset your energy consumption by purchasing the renewable attributes of wind energy produced in eastern Colorado.

Local renewable fund

If you want to support future development of local renewable projects, you can sign up for a monthly contribution. Together, GCEA members' contributions will be used when needed to overcome a financial hurdle to a local renewable project.

Community solar garden

The community solar garden is a way for you to offset your electric consumption with solar energy. Members are eligible to lease solar shares on a month-to-month basis or participate in a 20-year lease agreement. All short-term shares are currently leased out. Camp and tour for high school students

GCEA offers leadership opportunities for high school juniors to help them prepare for the future. The Washington D.C. Youth Tour introduces students to the nation's capital with tours of museums and historic monuments, meetings with Colorado congressional delegations and fun-filled activities.

Another great way for students to prepare for their future is through the Leadership Camp. Every July, the camp is held at Glen Eden Resort near Steamboat Springs. For nearly 40 years, electric cooperatives in Colorado, Kansas, Oklahoma and Wyoming have provided this outstanding camp for students who are interested in leadership and electric cooperatives.

Although students learn a lot in one week, it's not all hard work. Each year there is a float trip down the Colorado River, a trip to Fish Creek Falls and plenty of free time to swim, play volleyball and meet new friends. The 2022 Youth Tour and Leadership Camp applications are due Friday, December 3, 2021.



Scholarships

GCEA has provided students scholarships for decades, thanks to unclaimed patronage capital; the generosity of members; the Allen, Somrak and Drake families; Tri-State Generation and Transmission; Basin Electric Power Cooperative; individual directors; and GCEA employees. A student is eligible to receive a scholarship if the student and their parent, legal guardian or foster home receive electrical service from GCEA. In 2021, GCEA awarded 84 student scholarships. The 2022 scholarship application deadline is March 1, 2022.

We are thankful for the past and present dedicated members who helped GCEA get to where it is now. The co-op's devoted employees will continue powering possibilities for its consumer-members.
