hen making a major purchase, most buyers look for financial incentives to help sweeten the deal. Electric vehicles definitely have an advantage when penciling out the total cost of ownership. Here are five ways that EVs can save you money.



- REBATES: GCEA offers rebates on electrical system upgrades and charging equipment to support EV charging at home.
- INSTALLATION: 50% rebate up to \$250 on the cost of installing a 240-volt outlet to support a Level 2 EV charging station
- EQUIPMENT: 70% rebate up to \$500 on the cost of a Level 2 charging station (requires switch to a time-of-use rate). Call 970-641-3520 to request a TOU (time-of-use) analysis on your account to see if you qualify to switch.



- 2. TAX CREDITS: Depending on the vehicle you purchase, there are federal and state tax credits available to you.
- FEDERAL TAX CREDIT: up to \$7,500.
- CO STATE TAX CREDIT: \$2,500.
- EV CHARGING STATION
  EQUIPMENT: 30% up to \$1,000 of the station cost.



3. LOWER MAINTENANCE

COSTS: With fewer moving parts susceptible to wear and tear on the vehicle, maintenance costs are less and you'll save time not visiting the auto shop.



4. LOWER FUEL COST: The average cost-per-gallon equivalent for fueling an EV with electricity is \$1.10 per gallon compared to \$2.80 for gasoline. When charging on GCEA's TOU rate, that cost could drop down to 82 cents per gallon equivalent.



5. CHARGING DISCOUNTS:

## 2020 Allocation

The 2020 capital credit allocation was processed on July 2. GCEA allocated \$740,303 in GCEA Patronage Capital and \$223,518 in Tri-State Generation and Transmission Patronage Capital, for a total allocation of \$963,821. Allocation information including GCEA, Tri-State and total unretired capital credits were printed on July bills. A separate notice of allocation was mailed to inactive members and Patronage Capital certificates for the 2020 GCEA Allocation went out to 7,382 members on July 19.

## GCEA Celebrates Another EV **Charging Station**

n Thursday, July 15, GCEA celebrated the installation of its 13th EV charging station, located in Crested Butte South, with a ribbon cutting event.

Neighbors and EV enthusiasts turned out in support of the Level 2 station which will give them the opportunity to charge closer to home. The next closest stations are in Crested Butte to the north and Almont to the south. Connected to a 240-volt connection, this station provides 25 miles of range per hour of charging and costs 8 cents per

kilowatt-hour during off-peak hours and 25 cents per kWh during peak hours, which are 5-10 p.m., Monday through Saturday.

station site, as well as the Charge Ahead Colorado grant and Tri-State Generation and Transmission rebates for funding most of this project.
