Deck the Halls SAFELY

- Use only lights, cords, animated displays and decorations rated for outdoor use.
- When decorating outside, look up and around for power lines. Never throw lights or other decorations into trees near power lines.
- Keep ladders, equipment and yourself at least 10 feet away from power lines.
- Cords should be plugged into outlets equipped with Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCIs).

Decorate This Holiday with Safety in Mind

here's nothing like putting up lights and decorations to get you in the holiday spirit. It's something that many do every year without incident, yet the holidays are also one of the most hazardous times of the year when it comes to electrical fires and accidents.

Safe Electricity offers several tips as you deck the halls this season:

- When decorating outside, look up and around for power lines. Never throw lights or other decorations into trees near power lines.
- Keep ladders, equipment and yourself at least 10 feet from power lines.
- Match plugs with outlets. Do not force a three-pronged plug into a two-pronged outlet or extension cord.
- Outside, use only lights, cords, animated displays and decorations rated for outdoor use. Follow the manufacturer's instructions on how

- to use them. Ensure outdoor outlets or extension cords are equipped with ground-fault circuit interrupters.
- Never string more strands of lights together than recommended by the manufacturer.
- Do not staple or nail through light strings or electrical cords. Use plastic or insulated hooks to hang lights.
- Do not attach cords to utility poles.

The outside of your home is not the only place to use caution. Use care when placing and decorating trees inside your home. Place fresh-cut and artificial trees away from heat sources such as registers, fireplaces and radiators, and water fresh-cut trees frequently. Turn lights off before you go to sleep, or use timers.

BILLING CORNER

2021 YEAR-END INFORMATION

The year 2021 will end soon and many of our consumer-members are reviewing their power consumption and costs for the past year. Because of the billing cycle, the December 2021 usage is not billed until the second week of January 2022.

Since the usage for the calendar year is not billed in the calendar year (December billed in January), what you paid at a certain location during the calendar year is not necessarily the 2021 usage. We can help you with any questions concerning your usage or energy charges. When requesting yearly information, please specify whether you need the yearly usage or the total amount paid during the year, or both.

If you have any questions or need information about your accounts, please contact our billing department at 1-800-660-2291 or come into the Akron office. We can easily give you the kilowatthour and energy charge figures for 2021. If you require more information than this, please allow us a few days to get it gathered. Please keep this in mind when requesting yearly information.
