

IS **ELECTRICITY** A GOOD BUY?

very day we see another story about inflation. The effect of rising prices is evident each time you fill up the car or go to the grocery store. The Federal Reserve now says that raising interest rates will keep inflation in check. If you are like me, you're scratching your head, wondering how exactly this makes sense. The rationale is that by raising interest rates, the economy will slow down, allowing supply to catch up to consumer demand. Will that actually work? No one really knows for sure.

Consumer concerns

Predictably, perhaps, the high cost of essentials was the topic of numerous comments in our last online survey. Our consumers said:

"Lower the cost per kilowatt-hour"

"Do everything possible to keep costs down"

"Lower rates"

"Help reduce my bill"

This concern is understandable. As someone who has worked in this industry for many years, here's what I can tell you about the cost of electricity: Mountain Parks Electric and its employees work hard every day to maintain and even lower costs. Over the past two years, employees have submitted ideas resulting in annual savings in excess of \$600,000. Those savings help to offset the rising cost of providing electricity. Like you, our costs of fuel, materials and health care are increasing.

That's the bad news.

MPE has not raised rates since 2017 and will not in 2022. That is six years without an increase. Even so, your comments got

me to thinking about how consumer costs have changed over time.

The value of \$1

Is electricity still a good buy? It's a question that implies two more: "What does a \$1 of electricity buy you today?" and "How has the cost increased compared to other essentials?"

In MPE's Annual Report (published in the April issue of *CCL*), we shared that \$1 of electricity buys:

- Wi-Fi router powered for 46 days
- LED bulb powered for 43 days
- iPhone charging for 460 hours
- 100 feet of heat tape powered for 12 hours
- 35 miles of driving a Tesla Model 3 That's still a good bargain, I think.


What if you compare the percentage increase in the last six years (2017 to 2022) of electricity to other essentials?

- Gas increased \$1.67/gallon or 69%
- Eggs increased \$0.54/dozen or 37%
- Bacon increased \$1.33/lb, or 23%
- Milk increased \$0.65/gallon or 20%
- MPE electricity per kilowatt hour increased 0%
- MPE Service Availability Charge increased 0%






ecently, Mountain Parks Electric conducted a 45-question consumer survey. The survey focused on household electric use, residential energy-efficiency, customer satisfaction and other metrics. We were pleased that 547 consumers participated in the survey, giving a margin of error of +/- 0.9% with a 95% degree of probability. This means there is a 95% chance that the results

do not vary by more than 0.9% from the answers the entire MPE consumer base would have given if polled. These survey results give the MPE board and staff insights into current consumer trends and are helpful in making business decisions to better serve you. 


BY DROP BOX

2. Toggl

This app boosts your productivity by timing your daily tasks. You can then evaluate how your daily processes and habits can be improved.

3. Pocket

Save the articles you want to read or watch later all in the same place. You can use any device to come back and read/watch the content, even with no Wi-Fi!

4. SmartHub

This app is available on MPE's website. With it, you can monitor your hourly electric usage, access your historic usage, view past electric bills, and even access a link to read *Colorado Country Life* online.

"I have one special ingredient I add to cakes and brownies: Pudding. YES PUDDING — a simple ingredient that dramatically affects texture, density and flavor. Just sprinkle pudding powder into the batter, then mix. If it sits too long before baking, it gets thick. I recommend a quick remix.
