GIVING BACK

December is here at last. Thanksgiving celebrations are still fresh in our minds and the holiday season is in full swing. It is a time of year when we reflect on what we accomplished in 2022 and the hopes and dreams we have for 2023. It is also a time of year when we think about how we can help support our community in taking care of those in need and providing opportunities for our community to grow.

You may not realize it, but as a member of Empire Electric Association, you play an important part in supporting our community. Beyond the obvious part of paying your monthly bill, which helps EEA invest and upgrade our distribution system to safely and reliably meet your electrical energy needs, you also help support community groups and organizations, fund learning opportunities for our youth and provide assistance to those in need.

Each year EEA's board of directors approves requests for donations and sponsorships as part of the budgeting process. In 2022, EEA funded over \$90,000 of these requests for a wide variety of organizations in our community. Below is a partial list of the groups that EEA donated to:

- Eight fire departments
- Five libraries
- 4H livestock sales in Montezuma and Dolores counties in Colorado and San Juan County, Utah
- The Bridge Shelter
- Four Corners Child Advocacy Center
- San Juan BOCES Science Fair
- Hospice of Montezuma
- K-9 Search and Rescue
- School Community Youth Collaborative
- Montezuma School to Farm Project
- VFW Stand Down for Veterans
- Monticello and Dolores Christmas lighting contests

One of the largest budgeted donations EEA makes is for matching gifts to Energy Outreach Colorado, whose mission is to ensure that all Coloradans can afford their energy needs through bill payment assistance, energy-efficiency improvements and emergency repair of heating systems. Energy Outreach Colorado works with partner agencies in our service area to assist those who cannot pay their heating bill. You can help our community by donating to Energy Outreach Colorado at energyoutreach.org/donate. You also have the option to sign up for a monthly donation that will be added to your EEA power bill. Donations made through a bill addition will be matched by EEA to double your impact. Any funds budgeted for Energy Outreach Colorado that are not used in matching other donations are donated annually to the Piñon Project.

EEA also believes in the value of education and provides scholarships to active members and their dependents. Five different categories of scholarships are available:

- Student scholarships for high school seniors attending accredited two-year community colleges or four-year college and university programs.
- Continuing education scholarships for student scholarship winners that are continuing their two- or four-year program.
- Adult scholarships for individuals who are attending accredited two-year community colleges or four-year college and university programs.
- Lineman scholarships for individuals pursuing a vocational/technical certificate as a lineman.

- Electrical-related trade scholarships for individuals pursuing a vocational/technical certificate in an electrical related trade.

The scholarships vary from \$500 to \$1,000 per school year and require submitting an application that will be reviewed and ranked to determine the winners. EEA awarded \$39,000 in scholarships for the 2022–2023 school year. Applications for the 2023–2024 school year scholarships are available December 1 with the exception of the continuing education scholarships which open May 1, 2023.

The funds used for donations, sponsorships and scholarships come from unclaimed capital credits and are limited by EEA board policy. EEA is a member-owned rural electric cooperative that provides power to our membership. Any revenue EEA has after paying expenses in a year are called margins, and all margins are allocated each year to active members as capital credits. Allocated capital credits are held by EEA and used to fund cooperative operations instead of borrowing money and paying interest on loans.

Capital credits are retired and paid to members each year as long as EEA

remains in good financial standing as determined by our board. EEA targets an approximate 20-year retirement cycle, so members with allocated capital credits from 2002 and 2003 received over \$1.6 million in 2022 capital credit retirements. Active members can choose to have their capital credit retirement paid as a bill credit or by check. Inactive members are paid by check.

Each year EEA has capital credit checks returned because the mailing address we have for inactive members is not correct. EEA uses these unclaimed capital credits to fund our donations, sponsorships and scholarships. It's important to maintain an accurate mailing

address with EEA so that you receive your future capital credit retirements.

Unclaimed capital credits can be paid to an inactive member if they can provide proof of their membership. If you know someone who has moved from our area and may be missing capital credits they are owed, they can review the list EEA publishes on its website that is updated each year. 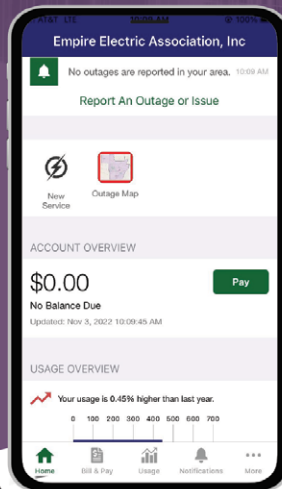

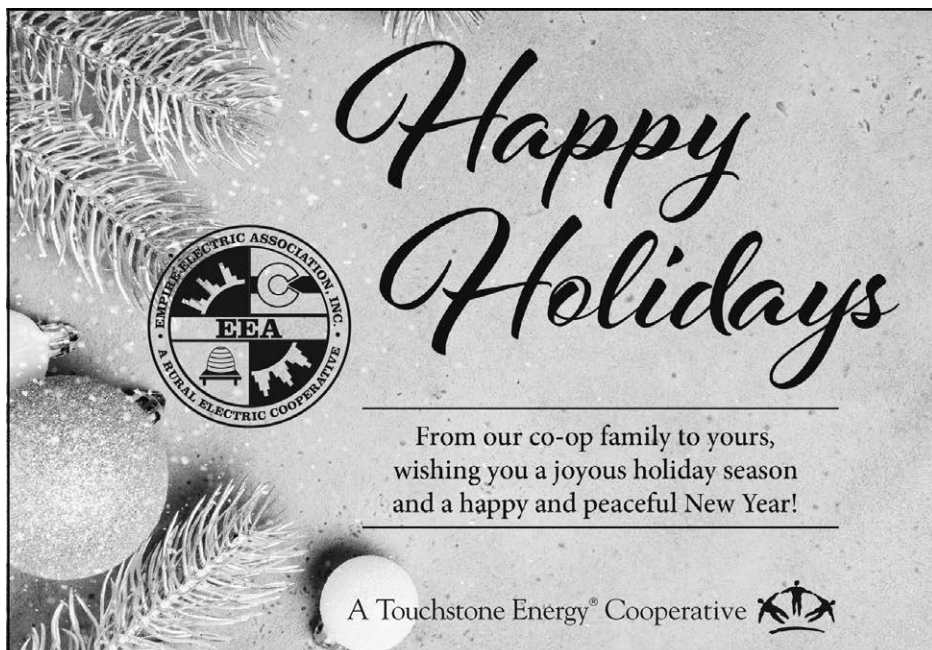

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

Blocked air vents force your heating system to work harder than necessary and increase pressure in your ductwork, which can cause cracks and leaks to form.

Make sure all air vents are unobstructed from furniture, drapes or other items to ensure sufficient circulation throughout your home. If necessary, purchase a vent extender, which can be placed over a vent to redirect air flow from underneath furniture.
