

At Poudre Valley REA, we believe in supporting education in science, technology, engineering, arts, and math (STEAM) for classrooms across our service territory. Our Empower Grant Program provides funding for STEAM projects every year, and we were thrilled to visit one of this year's grant winners, Noah Walsh, an Engineering and Technology teacher from Roosevelt High School.

Noah will be using his grant to purchase Solid Professor, an online CAD curriculum platform featuring lessons on Solidworks, Inventor, and Fusion 360. This program helps 10th through 12th graders in two classes prepare for their Autodesk Fusion 360 Certified User Exam.

"Students who pass this Fusion 360 exam will earn an industry-level certificate, allowing them to potentially enter the workforce right out of high school," said Noah. "The Solid Professor curriculum will enhance student learning, and it will ensure students are well prepared to earn industry-level certificates."

This curriculum benefits students in a variety of ways. It will set them apart, as they'll have a deeper understanding of 3D drafting and modeling. It allows for the freedom to learn at their own pace, choosing a pathway that fits their needs best. And if at least four of the 27 students pass, the school will receive additional funding from the state, meaning the grant will continue to give year after year. With a current goal of 75% of eligible students for the Fusion 360 Certified User Certificate passing, this goal is easily obtainable.

With the platform, students can plan, create, and

see their designs come to life. They start off by sketching and designing multiple versions of their design and then transferring their drawings into the Solid Professor program. From there, the students test and refine their designs, as the program helps guide them on functionality, errors, and ways to improve. As they finalize designs, they then make their design tangible using a 3D printer, laser cutter, or physical construction.

safety corner Thunderstorm Safety Tips

When thunderstorms are rolling your way, stay safe with these helpful tips from the American Red Cross.

TOP TIPS

- Watch for signs of a storm, like darkening skies, lightning flashes, or increasing wind.
- Listen to local news or NOAA Weather Radio for emergency updates.
- Avoid electrical equipment and telephones. Use battery-powered TVs and radios instead.
- Do not take a bath, shower, or use plumbing.
- If thunder roars, go indoors! The National Weather Service recommends staying inside for at least 30 minutes after the last thunderclap.

- Postpone outdoor activities if thunderstorms are likely to occur. Many people struck by lightning are not in the area where it is raining!
- If a severe thunderstorm warning is issued, take shelter in a substantial building or in a vehicle with the windows closed. Get out of mobile homes that can blow over in high winds.
- If you are outside and cannot reach a safe building, avoid high ground; water; tall, isolated trees; and metal objects such as fences or bleachers. Picnic shelters, dugouts, and sheds ARE NOT safe.

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

Looking for additional ways to save energy this summer? Your laundry room is a great place to start.

Wash clothes with cold water, which can cut one load's energy use by more than half. Your washing machine will use the same amount of energy no matter the size of the clothes load, so fill it up when you can. Loads will dry faster and more evenly if you separate heavier cottons like linens and towels from your lightweight clothing.
